NOTICE TO BIDDERS

The bid documents for this project will be issued through the City of Los Angeles (CLA) Regional Alliance Marketplace for Procurement (www.RAMPLA.org). Refer to the section entitled "Bid Documents" in this "Project Description" for information on how to obtain these bid documents.

WORK DESCRIPTION

The project scope for North Outfall Sewer (NOS) Rehab Unit 33 includes the rehabilitation of approximately 2,232 feet of 51-inch and 3,663 feet of 39-inch clay tile-lined reinforced concrete semi-elliptical pipe with reinforced polymer mortar pipe (RPMP) by sliplining. This is a total of 5,895 linear feet. The project involves constructing seven (7) access pits, the removal and replacement of three (3) existing maintenance holes, the removal and replacement of one (1) existing maintenance hole with construction of one (1) new transition structure, retrofitting and rehabilitating one (1) maintenance hole, construction of one (1) new maintenance hole, and reconnecting eight (8) existing lateral sewers. In addition, this project includes the work to install 2,784 linear feet of five (5) 8-inch diameter Vitrified Clay Pipe (VCP) local sewers, the reconnection of forty-two (42) house connections to the new local sewers and constructing trap house connections. Furthermore, CCTV Laser and sonar profiling, sewer cleaning, sewer debris removal and disposal, odor control, sewer bypassing, traffic control, monitoring of existing structures, and community impact mitigation will be required as part of the project.

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DESIGN AND FUNDING

The plans and specifications were prepared by the City of Los Angeles, Bureau of Engineering's Wastewater Conveyance Engineering Division (WCED). The funding for this project is from the Sewer Construction and Maintenance Fund (SCMF).

ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE:

The City has complied with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resource Code, Sec. 21000 et. sec.) for the project.

CONTRACT BONDS

A "Bid Bond" is required. The successful bidder shall provide two good and sufficient surety bonds. The "Payment Bond" and "Performance Bond" shall each be for not less than 100 percent of the contract Price.

CONTRACTOR'S LICENSE CLASSIFICATION

At the time of bid, the contractor must possess a valid State of California Contractor's License Classification of "A".

ESCROW BID DOCUMENTS

All Bidders must abide by the requirements listed in the General Requirements, Section 01351 "Escrow Bid Documents," including the timely submittal of the Escrow Bid Documents by the three low Bidders.

The Escrow Bid Documents shall be submitted to the Board of Public Works Office, by the three (3) low Bidders, in sealed containers, within forty-eight (48) hours after the time for receipt of Bids. The containers shall be clearly marked on the outside with the Bidder's name, date of submittal, project name and the words "Escrow Bid Documents".

PROJECT LABOR AGREEMENT

This project is subject to the provisions of the Department of Public Works Project Labor Agreement in Part IV of the Bid Proposal.

LOCAL BUSINESS PREFERENCE PROGRAM

This project is subject to the provisions of the City’s Local Business Preference Program. Los Angeles Administrative Code Division 10, Chapter 1, Article 4, Section 10.25 adopted the Local Business Preference (LBP) Program which was designed to increase local employment and expenditures in the local private sector. All Bidders are eligible to participate in the LBP Program. The City shall grant a six percent (6%) bid reduction of their Bid amount solely for Bid evaluation purposes to those bidders who are certified as a Local Business Enterprise (LBE) firm. If the LBE is also a Local Small Business (LSB) and/or Local Transitional Employer (LTE), they may be granted an additional two percent (2%) reduction for each of those certifications, up to a total of ten percent (10%). The City shall grant a ten percent (10%) bid reduction of their Bid amount solely for Bid evaluation purposes to those Bidders who are certified as a City Business Enterprise (CBE) firm. If the CBE is also a LSB and/or LTE, they may be granted an additional two percent (2%) reduction for each of those certifications, up to a maximum of twelve percent (12%). Additionally, all non-LBE/CBE Bidders may be granted a one percent (1%) bid reduction of their Bid amount solely for Bid evaluation purposes, up to a maximum of five percent (5%), for every ten percent (10%) of their bid that is to be performed by a LBE, CBE, LSB and/or LTE subcontractor.
